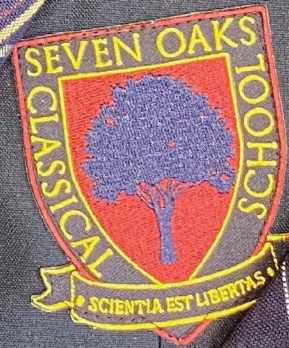

GUIDELINES

Introduction

At Seven Oaks Classical School, students are expected to wear uniforms, and to maintain good hygiene and an orderly appearance. The goal is to reduce distractions, to level the playing field socially, and to elevate the tone of the school. Wearing the uniform is a token of respect, of gratitude, and – we hope – of school pride.

It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that students arrive in dress code, and it is the responsibility of the school to ensure that the students remain so through the school day. When students are out of dress code, we will try to help them get back in uniform. The goal is not punishment, but simply to fix the problem. Where possible, the student will be loaned or sold a replacement piece.

Families should consult the school website for the latest uniform guidelines, as well as a link to the school's approved uniform vendor.

Dress and Grooming

The following policies shall also be applicable to the students of Seven Oaks Classical School.

- Students may wear their own outerwear (coats, sweaters, vests) to school and on the playground. If students are cold in the classroom, they should wear one of the long-sleeve uniform items or one of the uniform outerwear items unless otherwise given prior permission by the teacher. If they are still cold, they should ask their teacher's permission to put on an additional layer. Blankets are not permitted.
- Skirts shall fall no higher than just above the knee when standing.
- Girls must wear gym shorts or privacy shorts underneath their skirts.
- Student's backpacks and lunchboxes should avoid distraction. Parents are encouraged to look for plain, neutral designs. Character prints are not allowed.
- Hair must be clean, neat, out of the eyes, and styled in a way that is not attention-grabbing. Only natural colors are allowed.
- Modest jewelry will be allowed. An object that has a purpose other than jewelry cannot be worn as jewelry (i.e., chains or collars). Students may wear no more than two necklaces at one time. Visible piercings must be limited to the ears or nose. Girls may not wear earrings larger than a quarter. Nose piercings may be maintained through a small stud; rings are not permitted. No stretched piercings (e.g., gauges) or holes may be visible. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings on campus.
- Only school-issued insignia (e.g., lapel pins) are permitted to be worn with the uniform.
- Makeup must look natural. Black nail polish and lipstick or other similarly attention-grabbing accents are not permitted. Press-on nails or nail extensions that are longer than a quarter inch are not permitted.

GUIDELINES

- Other than religious headgear, no hats, visors, bandanas, sunglasses or the like will be permitted in class.
- Students shall maintain good personal hygiene at all times. This includes wearing neat, clean clothing in good repair. Strong or offensive odors or excessive use of perfumes or cologne are inappropriate. Similarly, tattered, worn, unstitched, or significantly stained pieces are inappropriate.

The school will work with students and parents to resolve any issues in a timely manner.

Uniform Infractions

Students should come to school clean and in uniform. Students who are significantly out of uniform or whose hygiene poses a potential danger or distraction will be sent to the office. If necessary parents will be contacted for assistance. For minor uniform issues, students will receive up to three warnings per semester. With each warning, the student's infraction will be logged, a loaner item will be issued (if available) or a replacement item offered for purchase. The student will be sent back to the classroom, and the parent will be notified.

After three uniform slips—or for a single instance where a student is substantially out of uniform—if presence in the classroom would present a significant distraction, the student will be held from class until the missing item can be supplied by a parent if a suitable replacement is not available for loan or for purchase.

Class time that is missed because a student is out of uniform is considered unexcused.

Uniforms and Financial Assistance

The school does not want financial need to present a barrier to enrollment. At a minimum, for families who qualify for financial assistance, the school is willing to help the students acquire one set of uniform pieces with the school plaid or crest (e.g., skirt, tie, blazer, sweater).

RECENT UPDATES

Updates for 2024-2025:

Although we love our uniform and want to preserve the overall look and feel, next year's uniform will see a few modest changes aimed at making the uniform just a bit simpler or more user friendly. In the upper grades, we also sought to make a stronger distinction between regular dress days and formal days.

- Belts are optional for K-1
- Replacement of Peter Pan collared shirts for regular white polos
- Addition of white polo for daily wear in Middle School
- Removal of khaki pant option for K-8
- Removal of blue pant option for 9-12
- Removal of white knee high socks K-12
- Replacement of white Oxford for Blue Oxford for Formal Friday for K-12
- Continuation of crossover tie for K-12 girls
- Choice of skort or kilt for 3-12 girls
- Addition of modesty shorts, leggings or tights under jumper and kilt K-12 girls
- Addition of sweater options for High School daily wear
- Additional sweater styles for K-12 daily wear
- Students are welcome to wear their formal uniform with or without the tie Monday-Thursday.



COMMON MISTAKES

K-2 Common Mistakes:

- Black athletic shoes are not permitted (absent a doctor's note)
- Polo shirts are not allowed on Friday or other designated formal days
- Cardigan style sweaters must be worn on Formal Friday
- On formal days, girls wearing a jumper should wear the crossover tie
- Modesty shorts, navy leggings or tights must be worn under jumper
- No unnatural hair color or extensions

3-5 Common Mistakes:

- Black athletic shoes are not permitted (absent a doctor's note)
- Black belt must be worn with slacks
- Polo shirts are not allowed on Friday or other designated formal days
- Blazer must be worn on Friday
- Modesty shorts, navy leggings or tights must be worn under kilt
- No unnatural hair color or extensions
- Students are welcome to wear their blazer any day of the week, but the blazer must be worn with the blue oxford shirt, blazers cannot be worn with a polo.

6-8 Common Mistakes:

- Black athletic shoes are not permitted (absent a doctor's note)
- Black belt must be worn with slacks
- Polo shirts are not allowed on Friday or other designated formal days
- Blazer must be worn on Friday
- Modesty shorts, navy leggings or tights must be worn under kilt
- No unnatural hair color or extensions
- Students are welcome to wear their blazer any day of the week, but the blazer must be worn with the blue oxford shirt, blazers cannot be worn with a polo

9-12 Common Mistakes:

- Black athletic shoes are not permitted (absent a doctor's note)
- Black belt must be worn with slacks
- Oxford style, Oxford blue shirt must we worn daily
- Blazer must be worn on Friday
- Modesty shorts, navy leggings or tights must be worn under kilt
- No unnatural hair color or extensions
- Students are welcome to wear their blazer any day of the week

*Black/Navy modesty shorts, navy leggings, or navy tights must be worn under kilt

OPTION 2: Any navy/maroon crested sweater or navy crested blazer,, blue oxford shirt, khaki non-pleated slacks, black belt, black/navy socks, black dress shoes



9-12 GIRLS FORMAL

Friday

OPTION 1: Crested blazer, blue oxford shirt, plaid skirt or kilt, plaid crossover tie or high school tie, navy knee socks, black dress shoes



*Black/Navy modesty shorts, navy leggings, or navy tights must be worn under kilt

OPTION 2: Crested blazer, blue oxford shirt, khaki non-pleated slacks, black belt, plaid crossover tie or high school tie, black/navy socks, black dress shoes



9-12 BOYS DAILY
